This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Ngati Te Whiti.

## Land status and history

This land was acquired by the New Plymouth Borough Council through subdivision in the early 1900's; as reserve for the purpose of a public plantation and pleasure ground subject to the Public Reserves, Domains and National Parks Act 1926.

## **Existing improvements**

A playground consisting of a swing set and two seesaws exists on this reserve.

This reserve is suitable for child's play and picnicking.






