Reserve status: Not subject to the Reserves Act.



Physical description

The frontage of this reserve is largely flat, being an open grass area with a number of specimen trees, mainly pohutukawas. A wetland area exists towards the back of the reserve with bush to the south of this.

Tangata whenua interests

This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Manukorihi, Pukerangiora and Otaraua Hapu.

Land status and history

The council holds this land as an endowment under the Waitara Habour Act 1940.

Existing improvements


A playground is located on the reserve consisting of a slide, seesaw and swing set. A fence exists around the wetland area.


Uses and activities


This reserve is suitable for children's play and picnicking. This reserve is also part of the Waitara walkway.
