#### 6.15 Wallace Place Reserve

## **Description**

Location: Wallace Place.

Legal description: Sect 577 Town of New Plymouth.

Size: 0.10 ha. Reserve status: Reserve



## Physical description

This reserve is a flat section surrounded by residential properties on Wallace Place.

#### Tangata whenua interests

This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi and Nga Mahanga a Tairi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Ngati Te Whiti and Te Kotahitanga o Nga Mahanga a Tairi.

#### Land status and history

This land was originally leased by the New Plymouth City Council in a perpetual Educational Reserve lease with the crown. A clause of this lease gave the council the authority to purchase the freehold land from the crown, which they did in 1951 for the sum of 520 pounds.

#### **Existing improvements**

A medium sized playground exists consisting of a slide, flying fox, climbing frame, see saws and a swing set. This playground equipment was donated by Margret Hales in 1999.

**Parks** 

Two wooden and one steel park benches exist. The steel bench was donated in memory of Alexander Mafe King Eagles and Rawea Phyllis Eagles of Wallace Place, who spent many happy hours at this playground as a child.

A small shed situated on the reserve is used for the storage of Parks equipment.

#### Uses and activities


This reserve is suitable for child's play and picnics.
