# 6.3 Bromley Place Reserve

# **Description**

Location: Bromley Place Legal description: Lot 29 DP 9666

Size: 0.25 ha Reserve status: Reserve



## **Physical description**

The reserve is located in the residential suburb of Frankleigh Park and fronts Bromley Place. It is predominately a grassed open space which slopes down towards the Waimea Stream at the rear of the reserve. A number of specimen trees exist on the south-west side.

# Tangata whenua interests

This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Ngati Te Whiti.

### Land status and history

In 1953 the land was vested as reserve in the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of New Plymouth, upon subdivision.

### **Existing improvements**

At the road front a timber barrier is in place. A playground consisting of a small modular unit with a slide, swings and a seesaw exist towards the front of the reserve. There is also a park bench.

### Uses and activities


This reserve is suitable for child's play and picnicking. It is also used as access to the Waimea walkway which runs along the Waimea Stream.


# Management objectives and specific policies
